ADMINISTRATION INSTRUCTION – Bronze Qualifying Expedition

General: Pate's Grammar School will conduct qualifying expeditions for the following Bronze Duke of Edinburgh groups on 11-12 May 2024.

Aim: The aim of the two-day qualifying expedition is to successfully complete two day walks and one overnight camping.

OED advises parents not to turn up for collection until they receive a phone call otherwise, they could be waiting for a long time. Please ensure the participants have the contact phone number for the person who will be collecting them. We will ensure that students give parents at least an hour's notice before they are due to reach the collection point.

Equipment: Please refer to the 'Equipment' document for detailed personal equipment list.

- Please check the weather forecast and plan for wet weather if necessary but as a minimum I expect all students to carry a lightweight waterproof jacket in their rucksack. Walking Boots with ankle support are a must, walking sandals/trainers and wellies will not be accepted.
- This is also a reminder that we do not want to see any strappy tops or mini shorts on any of the expeditions, students who turn up dressed like this will be turned away.
- Please remember that when you are walking in long grass or around sheep and cattle there can be the danger of ticks etc. so lightweight walking trousers are strongly advised.
- Accompanying staff will carry all safety equipment so the following group equipment will be issued
 on the morning of the event:
- Teams will be liable for any damage caused to this equipment whilst it is in their care.

Food & Drink: Participants must bring their own lunch and snacks for the walk, including dinner for Saturday evening and breakfast and lunch for Sunday. Students must carry 2 litres of water for both days, there will be opportunity to refill their water bottles on route. Participants will not be able to buy food during the trip. We advise food is high in calories and nutritional value. Fizzy drinks such as Coca Cola are not advisable. Please also ensure they eat a substantial breakfast beforehand.

Risk Assessment & Emergency procedures: Groups will be managed with "remote-supervision" by a member of staff designated to each group, checkpoints will be in place to monitor their progress. Risk Assessments have been completed and are issued to all staff involved. All participants and assistants will receive a thorough briefing at the start of the activity.

Medical: Medical procedures are detailed within our risk assessment and all our staff hold a current First Aid qualification. As well as the First Aid Kit the expedition staff carry, there is a comprehensive First Aid Kit and stretcher held inside the safety vehicle stationed with our qualified safety staff.

Pupils with medication must be responsible to self-administer. In the event of Asthma, the inhaler must be carried in a waterproof container and location made known to the instructors. The instructors will confirm this prior to embarking on the training.

Behaviour/Standards: Sensible behavior is expected at all times. Staff reserve the right to exclude participants from any and all activities in the unlikely event that such a standard of behavior is not maintained, or if safety is compromised. Participants are reminded that they are to adhere to the DofE 20 Conditions at all times. Failure to do this may result in the day walk having to be re-taken. Pupils are to follow the country code, particularly to leave no litter.

Command and signal:

Mobile phones: As this is an official qualifying expedition, any use of a mobile phone by any member of any group, other than for the sole use for an emergency is strictly forbidden. Phones will be checked before and after the expedition by the assessor. Anyone found using a mobile phone to gain an advantage towards their DofE award may be deferred and will have to complete another day walk. This could also extend to their whole group being deferred. We advise that mobile phones are safely secured in their bag where they will not get damaged or affected by water. If students wish to take photos, we advise bringing a camera with spare batteries.

Radios: All staff and groups will be allocated radios. The 9-seater van will be equipped with a radio and will be utilized as the safety and command vehicle throughout the expedition.
